



## FirstEnergy RFP for 2019 Ohio Compliant RECs - FAQs

Below is the list of FAQs received from bidders to date and responses.

### **1. Is it too late to file for PUCO certification? Would someone who hasn't filed yet be able to participate?**

FirstEnergy Ohio Utilities are looking for 2019 eligible RECs and SRECs, not unit-contingent RECs or SRECs. If you have a renewable energy generating facility that has not been qualified by the PUCO or hasn't submitted an application to the PUCO, it is too late to receive PUCO certification and produce RECs. However, since the RFP isn't unit-contingent, you have the option of proposing RECs you may have in your portfolio as long as the RECs meet the eligibility requirements of the RFP.

### **2. Can pumped storage qualify for Ohio RECS?**

Ohio's renewable energy portfolio standard revised code, which provides a definition of renewable energy resources, is Section 4928.01(A)(37). The code changes on 10/22/2019. Please review the two links below:
